What am I learning this half term?

We have a brilliant topic to kick start spring term 1 with excellent learning opportunities to inspire and motivate. It is all linked around fiction books!

This term on our Rocket Phonics we will be introduced to new texts and use new phonic sounds, we will continue to identify sounds in various places in a word. Our focus is blending words using synthetic systematic strategies. Also, our children will read and write daily in their guided reading groups.

In Mathematics we will recap number vocabulary and will be comparing numbers and explore the composition of numbers to 20. Also, we will time ordering and sequence events and timings of the day.

In Technology we will experiment with text, pictures, and animation in order to share a simple picture with their class. We will have the opportunity to bake and taste our own gingerbread biscuits!

Topic

Our topic this half term is Once **Upon a Time!** By the end of this topic children will have a good insight into comparing fiction and non-fiction books. In maths children will be able to compare numbers and understand the "one more" than relationship between consecutive numbers. Children will automatically recall number bonds for numbers 0-20 and explore the composition of number to 20. Children will know how to use media, tools, and materials for a purpose. In Art we will be learning about Vincent Van Gogh famous for his unique post-impressionist technique, with swathing brushstrokes and striking colours.

A Guide to using Tapestry



To view your child's learning journal

- 1. Login
- 2. Go to the 'children' tab (you will see your child's name only).
- 3. Click on your child's photo
- 4. Select 'view Joe's journal.'
- 5. Select the observation you wish to view.
- 6. Add a comment if you wish e.g. well done, or Joe also took turns in a board game at home this weekend.

To add your own observation at home....

To add notes....

- · Click on 'obs' tab at top of screen.
- Click on 'add observation.'
- Type in information; title, date notes.

To add a photo.....

- Click on 'add media' to upload a photo.
- Click on 'add file'
- Click on 'start upload'

Finally...Click save!

Your child's key person will then be notified of your observation and use it to support your child's learning and progress.
